On 17th February the Health Board held a 'Talk Health Your Voice Matters' event in Newport, inviting the public to have their say on a variety of health issues. There were lots of health related stands of which the CHC was one and our Members engaged with health professionals and members of the public to spread the word about what the CHC does.

Members also joined Melin Homes in promoting 'Digital Health' at two Newport Community Centres. The public were shown how to access 'My Health Online' to book GP appointments and repeat prescriptions.

Two Members attended the Welsh NHS Confederation Focus Group which was held to help the public make the best use of NHS services and encourage people to live healthier lifestyles. Lastly, the CHC had a stand at the Falls Prevention Workshop which focused on joined up working in the community and in hospitals, not just with healthcare, but also fire, police, community groups etc.

Visits

It has been a busy few months for our Members undertaking monitoring visits. The visit to the new A&E department at the Royal Gwent Hospital was extremely positive. Patients were handed over from ambulances within the 15 minutes target time and no patients were being treated in the corridors. Patients were happy with their care and didn't have to wait long to be seen.

The Maternity wards at the Royal Gwent Hospital were also positive; the wards are well run and patients were found to be happy.

As part of the Board of CHC's in Wales national projects, Members visited Dementia wards to ask patients 'What could the NHS do better to support people, as well as their families and their carers, living with dementia?' We had 170 responses locally and over 500 nationally.
