Dear Friends,
Welcome to Tredegar, the Home of
the NHS and to the second Bevan
Festival Week. Organised by Tredegar
Town Council it celebrates our favourite
son and Wales's greatest hero,
Aneurin Bevan.

Through his childhood and early years he witnessed the poor conditions that working families lived in, the way mine owners treated their employees and later in his own life the victimisation of union leaders. These injustices left a massive impression on Bevan and set his mind to making a difference for the people of Tredegar and the UK, becoming a lifelong champion of social justice, the rights of working people and democratic socialism.

One of my favourite Bevan quotes says , 'I never used to regard myself so much as a politician, as a projectile discharged from the Welsh valleys... when I listen to the cacophony of harsh voices trying to intimidate, I close my eyes and listen to the silent voices of the poor.' He never stopped fighting for the underprivileged and for those who did not have the wherewithal to stand up for themselves.

Later he used the Tredegar Workingmens Medical Aid Society as the Blueprint for the NHS to end the health and housing poverty trap faced by so many. In his own words he 'Tredegarised' the UK and introduced the National Health Service, giving healthcare free at the point of need and put in motion the largest public housing programme ever launched in Britain.

We continue to celebrate the man and his most wonderful gift to our nation this week and long may we continue to help those who need it most.


## **Armed Forces Day**

There will be stalls, music from the Royal Regiment of Wales, parades, services and lots of fun and activities. All funds raised will go to veterans charities.



## Bevan and his Tredegar

Aneurin Bevan was born on 15<sup>th</sup> November 1897, one of the 10 children born to David and Phoebe Bevan. They lived in a small terraced property in Charles Street. His dad was a miner, his mother a seamstress.

Tredegar at the turn of the century was a prosperous town yet poverty reigned for the working classes, with the powerful Tredegar Iron and Coal Company (TIC) hiring, firing and calling all the shots.

called the Query Club whose aim was to wrench the grip of power from the TIC. The club also raised and redistributed funds to needy members.



Bevan wasn't particularly academic at school, this in part due to the antagonistic head teacher who humiliated this shy stammering youngster. Nye left school at 13, going straight to the pit with his father where he joined The Fed and became a trade union activist. By the age of 19 he headed the Tredegar Lodge of the South Wales Miners Federation. He was already a well known orator but was regarded a troublemaker by the TIC who sacked him but had to reinstate him, following a victimisation battle.

Bevan earned a scholarship to the Central Labour College in London where he studied Marxism developing his socialist ideology.

Nye along with his brother Billy, Walter Conway and others formed a political debating society

Walter Conway was the secretary of Tredegar Medical Aid Society and mentored the young Nye who too was a member of the Cottage Hospital Management Committee. Nye was elected to Tredegar Urban District Council in 1922 and then won a seat on Monmouthshire County Council in 1928 before becoming MP for Ebbw Vale in 1929 General Election. Following the 1945 Labour landslide election, he became Minister for Health. He put in place the largest public housing building program and 'Tredegarised' the UK through establishing the National Health Service.

The NHS remains a cherished institution for the country just as Tredegar's Nye, our Nye will forever be Wales's greatest hero.

## Health and Well-Being Remains Strongly at the Heart of Tredegar



#### **Key Project Information**

Aneurin Bevan University Health Board are planning to build a new Integrated Health And Well-Being Centre in Tredegar, on the site of the former General Hospital on Park Row. The purpose of the Centre is twofold:

- 1. to ensure healthcare services are provided from high quality, fit for purpose buildings
- 2. to bring healthcare professionals, third sector and other providers under one roof to ensure a coordinated approach to health and well-being.

The Centre will have a focus on 'Pharmacy First' with a Pharmacist being situated at the front of the new Centre that can assist with a range of minor ailments, often without an appointment.

These ailments include:

- Sore throat
- Backache
- Diarrhoea

- Chicken Pox
- Indigestion
- Nappy Rash

- Constipation
- Hay fever
- Head lice

- Dermatitis

Together with Blaenau Gwent County Borough Council and our Third Sector partners, the Health and Well-being Resource Centre will form part of a vibrant community hub which will be available to all residents in Tredegar. It will include:

- GP Services
- Learning Disability Services
- Dental Services
- Memory Assessment Clinics
- Flying Start
- Community Pharmacy Services
- Dieticians
- Citizens Advice Bureau
- District Nurses
- Sexual Health Services
- Podiatry Services Well-being Support

- Speech and Language Therapy Services
- Space for Recreation and Leisure
- Diabetic Retinopathy
- Abdominal Aortic Aneurysm Screening
- Substance Misuse Services

In addition to medical services, the community hub will bring people together to support well-being, reduce loneliness and promote independent living, all in a welcoming environment.



#### What Will It Look Like?

The development of the Health and Well-being Resource Centre will retain part of the existing Hospital as the 'heart' of the new build. There will be full integration of existing buildings into the new design, which will have flexibility built in to it to deliver 21st Century health care planning and delivery. The architect's impression of the new build is shown above.

#### **Aneurin Bevan Memorial Stones**


The stones mark the spot where Aneurin Bevan, Labour MP for the Ebbw Vale constituency and architect of the National Health Service, addressed his constituents and the world. The hilside location saw enormous gatherings eager to hear one of the greatest orators in the history of British politics. The central monolith represents Bevan and the 3 smaller ones represent Rhymney, Tredegar and Ebbw Vale, the 3 towns in his constituency.

#### St James Pond

A recreational area found to the east of Georgetown, Tredegar surrounded by forestry. The site includes picnic areas and pathways accessible by all.

Fishing is also allowed with carp, perch, roach, rudd, and tench being the main fish available. Permits are available from Tredegar Angling Centre, 5 Morgan Street, Tredegar Town Centre, 01495 725570 or from the bank side bailiff.






